Roadeo Training & Technical Assistance Program

Introduction

Community Transportation Association has designed a training and technical assistance program aimed at assisting organizations seeking to develop a bus Roadeo for small bus (body-on-chassis), van and minivan classes. The program is led by nationally-recognized trainers in organizing and implementing bus Roadeos, and includes a manual to be customized for the organization, as well as operational and organizational training. The program provides guidelines for setting up a Roadeo to showcase the skills and abilities of front-line transit employees. It is modeled after the National Community Transportation Roadeo for small bus and van drivers.
